This weekend our gospel text was Jesus walking on the water towards the disciples. Peter, in his doubt challenges Jesus to command him to also walk on water. As Peter walks on the water towards Jesus, he cries out in fear, "Lord, save me!" And, with love and compassion, Jesus stretches out his arm to Peter, and invites him one more time to trust and believe in the presence of God in his midst.

This gospel text invites each of us to tune our hearts and minds to recognize the presence of God around us. There have been times in each of our lives when we want to yell, "Lord, save me!" At times, we might find God in the storminess of life; at other times we might discover God in moments of tranquility. As we enter this week, take note—look for the presence of God in places you least expect. You just might find God's love and mercy in a person you might not have considered previously. An experience of God might be found in a tiny whispering sound or in the midst of chaos and confusion. Like Peter, we need to be open to God coming to us in surprising ways and places.

Tuesday is a Holy Day. We will have a noon Mass on campus to celebrate the Feast of the Assumption.
