<u>Liturgy</u>

- We continue to hold two masses every Sunday (10am and 5pm) when school is in session, and one Sunday at 10am when school is not in session
- Our 10am mass is ASL interpreted
- We have on average 8 priests who alternate presiding for liturgy at RIT
- Average weekly mass attendance is 200 during the school year, and 30 during the summer
